Frequently Asked Questions

Q1 What does a design services practice cover in Indian IP law?

It covers the protection of visual and ornamental aspects of products, including industrial designs, graphical user interfaces, icons, and digital elements. The practice spans registration, enforcement, portfolio strategy, and licensing to safeguard product aesthetics and market differentiation.

Q2 When should a business consider filing for design protection in India?

Ideally before any public disclosure, since a design must be new and original at the filing date. Once a product's appearance is disclosed without protection, it may lose registrability. Early filing is also critical before trade launches, licensing discussions, or investor presentations.

Q3 Which law and authority govern design registration in India?

The Designs Act, 2000 and the Designs Rules, 2001 govern registration. The Controller General of Patents, Designs and Trade Marks, operating under the Department for Promotion of Industry and Internal Trade (DPIIT), administers the design registry based in Kolkata.

Q4 How long does Indian design registration typically take and what drives cost?

A straightforward application with no objections can be registered in six to nine months. Key cost drivers include the number of design classes, whether multiple designs are filed separately, responses to examination reports, and any international filings through the Hague System.

Q5 What documents are needed to file a design registration application?

You will need clear representations of the design from multiple views, the applicant's name and address, a statement of novelty, the relevant Locarno classification, and a priority document if claiming convention priority. For GUI designs, screenshots or visual renderings are typically required.

Q6 What common mistake do companies make when protecting product designs?

Many businesses publicly display a product, at exhibitions or online, before filing for design protection. Under the Designs Act, 2000, prior publication can invalidate a registration. Another frequent error is conflating design and patent protection, leaving aesthetic features unprotected.
