# Frequently Asked Questions

---

## Q1 What does an environmental law practice cover in India?

It covers regulatory approvals such as environmental clearances, consent to establish and operate, forest and wildlife permissions, CRZ approvals, waste management compliance, EPR obligations, carbon credit frameworks, ESG reporting, and representation before the National Green Tribunal and courts.

## Q2 When should a company engage environmental law counsel in India?

Ideally before project planning begins. Environmental clearance under the EIA Notification, 2006 and consent from State Pollution Control Boards must precede construction or operations. Engaging counsel early avoids delays, costly redesigns, and exposure to closure orders or NGT proceedings.

## Q3 Which regulators and statutes govern environmental compliance in India?

The MoEFCC administers the Environment (Protection) Act, 1986, the EIA Notification, 2006, and the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980. State Pollution Control Boards issue consents under the Water Act, 1974 and Air Act, 1981. The NGT adjudicates environmental disputes.

## Q4 How long does the environmental clearance process typically take?

Category A projects requiring EIA go through the Expert Appraisal Committee at MoEFCC, including scoping, EIA study, public hearing, and appraisal. The process typically takes 10 to 18 months. Category B projects appraised by SEIAAs may take 6 to 12 months depending on state timelines.

## Q5 What documents are needed to begin an environmental clearance application?

You will typically need a pre-feasibility report, land ownership records, site layout plans, a Form 1 or Form 1A application, ToR proposal for scoping, baseline environmental data, water and power requirement estimates, and a draft EIA report prepared by an accredited consultant.

## Q6 What compliance mistakes do companies most commonly make in environmental law?

Operating without timely renewal of Consent to Operate is common and triggers closure directions. Other frequent errors include missing EPR registration deadlines under waste management rules, incomplete public hearing documentation, and failing to report expansions that cross EIA thresholds.
