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### Q1 What does food safety and regulatory compliance practice cover in India?

It covers advisory across the food value chain on FSSAI licensing, labelling and ingredient compliance, product approvals, import and export clearances, traceability systems, and representation before the Commissioner of Food Safety during enforcement proceedings.

### Q2 When should a food business seek regulatory compliance advice in India?

Before launching a new product, entering a new food category such as nutraceuticals or novel foods, importing ingredients, facing an FSSAI inspection, or responding to a product recall notice. Early engagement reduces the risk of seizures, penalties, or licence suspension.

### Q3 Which law and regulator govern food safety compliance in India?

The Food Safety and Standards Act, 2006 is the primary statute. FSSAI is the central regulator and issues detailed regulations on licensing, labelling, packaging, food additives, contaminants, and product standards. State Commissioners of Food Safety handle enforcement and adjudication.

### Q4 How long does it take to obtain an FSSAI licence for food manufacturing?

A central FSSAI licence typically takes 30 to 60 days from filing a complete application, though timelines vary with product category and state authority responsiveness. Delays usually stem from incomplete documentation, facility non-compliance, or the need for product approvals for novel ingredients.

### Q5 What documents are needed to start FSSAI licensing or a compliance review?

Key documents include the entity's incorporation certificate, product formulations and ingredient lists, manufacturing unit layout and address proof, existing licences or registrations, lab test reports, and labelling artwork. For imports, the Bill of Entry and foreign supplier certifications are also required.

### Q6 What common compliance mistakes do food businesses make with FSSAI regulations?

Frequent errors include mislabelling nutritional values or allergen declarations, failing to update licences when adding product categories, non-compliance with packaging and shelf life norms, and inadequate traceability records. Each of these can trigger show cause notices, product recalls, or penalties under the Act.
