Q1 What does legal metrology compliance involve for businesses in India?

It includes correct labelling of MRP, net quantity, manufacturer details, and consumer care information on all packaged goods sold or imported into India.

Businesses should engage counsel before launching a new product, importing packaged goods, or onboarding on e-commerce platforms. Enforcement officers conduct market inspections without prior notice, and non-compliant labels can result in seizure of stock, prosecution, or compounding penalties.

Q3 Which regulators and statutes govern legal metrology in India?

The Legal Metrology Act, 2009 and the Legal Metrology (Packaged Commodities) Rules, 2011 are the primary statutes. The Department of Consumer Affairs administers the central framework, while state Legal Metrology departments handle registrations, inspections, and enforcement at the field level.

Q4 What is the typical process and timeline for legal metrology registrations?

Manufacturer, importer, and dealer registrations are filed with the relevant state Controller of Legal Metrology. Processing typically takes two to four weeks, depending on the state. Key cost drivers include the number of product categories, states of operation, and whether verification of instruments is also required.

We typically require product labels or artwork, FSSAI or BIS registrations if applicable, import shipment details, GST registration, and existing state legal metrology certificates. For enforcement matters, copies of inspection panchnamas, seizure memos, or show cause notices are needed at the outset.

Q6 What common labelling mistakes lead to legal metrology penalties?

Frequent errors include missing or incorrect MRP declarations, omitting the consumer complaints contact, using non-standard units of measurement, and failing to update labels after rule amendments. Even minor omissions can attract compounding fees or stock seizure during routine market inspections by enforcement officers.
